Long	WHAT	Igniting Curiosity Growing Capabilities (An Daras Trust's Vision)
		Inspiring passionate, lifelong learners who strive to make a positive contribution to their community and the world around them. (Windmill Hill's Vision) School's Dispositions (Learning sails): reflection, self-awareness, curiosity, resilience and tenacity and connect.

	WHEN	Whole School Long term horizontal map Whole school long term horizontal map that shows the learning connection blocks over the course of the year. Learning connection blocks are the same for each group at the same point to aid prior learning and progression but the concepts explored are different. Opportunities for enrichments, key texts, progression in metacognitive strategies are included.
	HOW	Knowledge and Skills Organisers Each organiser shows the knowledge and skills for each curriculum subject aligned to each class to demonstrate progression.
Medium		Learning Sequences (S Plans/Modular) Knowledge and skills organisers inform the sequences of learning for each class per half term. Opportunities for enrichments, key texts, progression in metacognitive strategies and developing capabilities are included. Knowledge organisers and shared with the pupils and parents at the start of each learning connection block.
Short		<b>Weekly Planning</b> To include key concepts, opportunities to revisit prior learning, learning intentions, success criteria, key guestioning and vocabulary.
